Camp OIB 2011

For your information

- **Reentry Decals:** The Town of Ocean Isle Beach has mailed your decals; please remember to affix them to your vehicle.
- **Beach Strand Trash Collection:** Due to recent changes in Waste Industries collection policies trash receptacles will no longer be located on the beach strand but will be available on the street side of all public accesses
- **Changes in sanitation pickup for May and September:** Mondays only except weeks of Memorial Day and Labor Day.
- **Rules for yard debris:** Debris must be placed in **BIODEGRADABLE BAGS** or cut, tied and bundled in 4-5 ft. lengths. Maximum weight must not exceed 50 lbs. Waste Industries is strictly enforcing these regulations. Yard debris pickup is on the first and third Friday of each month.
- **Beautification:** New areas have been planted this spring from the light in front of the Marathon station, Lantana beds have been expanded
- **Public Boat ramp parking:** Parking has been expanded and paved.
- **New public beach access:** Improved access at Island Park on the west end has been constructed.
- **Additional Beach Wheelchair:** Sloane Realty sales agents donated a beach wheelchair.
- **Causeway Drive Paved:** The Causeway was newly repaved from the traffic circle to the traffic light at Rt. 179. NCDOT portion of First and Second Streets were recoated.

CONCERT SERIES 2011 HAS A NEW LOOK!!!!

Thanks to your participation in the OIPOA the Concert Stage underwent necessary renovations this spring.

Renovations included:

Remove old plywood flooring and install new.

Scrape paint from trailer and frames, check tires for replacement, and paint trailer and frame
Fabricate and install new metal frame for awning with posts, attachment brackets roof trusses, and tie bars.

Upholster awning to cover roof with Sunberella fabric with 10 year warranty.

Upholster skirt for front of trailer using Sunberella fabric.

Detailed drawings of framing and awnings with instructions for installation and take-down.

We hope you will take note of our beautiful Causeway as you arrive at Ocean Isle Beach. Your Board has taken a slightly different approach this year to beautify our island while attempting to keep costs down. We have partnered with the Town to share ideas for planting and the cost of implementing these ideas. We have incorporated many perennials into our planting so we should not have to purchase as many annuals each year to fill our beds.

Also, please take note of the new bed established at the corner of Causeway Drive and Highway 179 on the Marathon Convenience Store side. This bed has been planted with crepe myrtles, red begonias and rudbeckia which should provide quite a show this summer. The Causeway is now lined with yellow lantana from Highway 179 to the roundabout and is providing a beautiful and colorful approach to the island.

OIB FAMILY SAND SCULPTURE RULES
SATURDAY – SEPT. 3, 2011 – 11:00 AM – 1:30PM
Community Center, 44 East 1st St.
(Rain Date: Sun. Sept. 4, 2011 – 11:00am – 1:30pm)

FAMILY DIVISION RULES

1. Construction of your sculpture must be confined to your flagged area.
2. Create anything you would like out of sand, keeping it appropriate for all ages.
3. You may use anything to build your sculpture, but only natural materials native to our beach may be used in your sand sculpture. You may collect shells, etc. days prior to the event and bring them with you to use on your sculpture.
4. Bring your own shovels, pails, spray bottles, etc. for creating your sculpture and please remove when you leave.
5. Extra water to wet your sand is allowed.
6. Do not go into the dunes for any reason or remove live sea grass.
7. Fill in any large holes after the contest but leave your sculpture to be admired by all.
8. Sculptures cannot begin before 11:00am day of the contest and will be judged at 1:30pm.
9. No painting or tinting of sand.
10. **ALL FAMILIES MUST HAVE FUN!!!!!!**

CHILDRENS DIVISION RULES

1. Children must be 13 yrs old and with no assistance from anyone over 14 yrs. old.
2. All rules listed above apply to the children's division.
3. **All children must have extra fun!!!!!!**

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

1. Restrooms available in the Community Center.
2. Judging based on; a. Originality b. Quality of work c. Group fun
3. Teams limited to 4 adults and as many children as you want in the Family Division
4. Number of team members in Children's Division is unlimited.
5. Trophies will be awarded at the end of contest in both divisions and in addition first place in the family division will receive a 1 yr. family membership to the Museum of Coastal Carolina. Non-participants will have the opportunity to vote for their favorite sculpture for \$1.00. All proceeds will go to the Museum of Coastal Carolina. This award will be called "The People's Choice Award" and the award will be given in both division Participants are asked to make a donation to the Museum of Coastal Carolina with their entry. Thank you!
6. Location of contest: Behind Community Center on the beach – 44 East 1st St. (Monroe St. beach access)
7. Ms. Allison from the Museum of Coastal Carolina will also be on the beach teaching children to create "Sea-Creations" using plaster of paris.

CAMP OIB SCHEDULE AND PROGRAM

Join us this summer at Camp OIB and enjoy spending time doing arts, crafts, games, story time and much more. CAMP OIB begins the first week of June and continues on a Monday-Thursday schedule through mid August. Camp time is from 10:00 am to 12:00 noon. Camp activities will not be held on July 4th due to the holiday. All children must be accompanied by an adult during the entire program. A typical program for each day's activities follows:

PUPPETS IN PARADISE MONDAY

Opening now... it's a Puppet Show at the New OIB Theatre. Dance the Limbo and play "Where's the Mermaid/Merman" Game. Enjoy craft-making with beads and shells. And don't forget to bring your video camera – it will be a great photo op.

Meet Nemo and play the Sea Turtle Game. You will learn to tie a square knot that you can take home with you. Enjoy crafts and story time with "Baby Sea Turtle" and interact with turtle eggs. The Power Squadron will have boats and equipment on site to teach children hands-on water safety information. Don't forget to bring your camera on board!

Dance the Hokey Pokey and Five Little Monkeys Jumping on the Bed. Enjoy beach games, making sun catchers, "Curious George" story time and studying our local shells. Hey Mom – "Look at me" and take a picture!

All hands on deck as we march to the Flag Parade and play the Cannonball Treasure Hunt. Then it's off to enjoy pirate flag crafts & "Jimmy and Pirate Talk" story time. You never know when Captain Greybeard will pay a visit so be sure to bring your camera!

CAMP OIB is available on a first come basis to all children ages 3-10. Participants are limited to 35 per day and no advance reservations are allowed. CAMP OIB is located at the Town's oceanfront Community Center, 44 East First Street. REGISTRATION for camp is held daily Monday-Thursday beginning at 10:00 AM and ending promptly at 10:20 AM, in order to allow for the fun to begin. Activity participant forms must be completed for all participants each morning prior to the start of camp.
